Chapter 265.

AN ACT Relating to the Licensing of Aircraft.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Registration fees. All resident aircraft owners shall register said aircraft with the secretary of state and the fee for such registration shall be \$1. All resident pilots shall register with the secretary of state and the fee therefor shall be \$1. All non-resident aircraft owners coming into the state for commercial purposes shall register with the secretary of state and shall pay a fee of \$15. All non-resident pilots coming into the state for commercial purposes shall register with the secretary of state and shall pay a fee of \$10.

Chapter 266.

AN ACT to Amend the Law Providing for Continuous Revision of the Statutes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. L., 1931, c. 210, § 2, ¶ 1, amended. The paragraph numbered (1) in section 2 of chapter 210 of the public laws of 1931 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'(1) During each session of the legislature to draft public laws at the request of members of the legislature provided the request for such drafting be made during the period expiring at least 1 week before the time set as a limit for the reception of public legislation and to revise all legislation so far as may be practicable so that it shall be in conformity with and may be properly inserted in the revised statutes, under the direction of the senate and house of representatives;'

Sec. 2. P. L., 1931, c. 210, § 2, ¶ 3, amended. The paragraph numbered 3 in section 2 of chapter 210 of the public laws of 1931 is hereby amended by striking out said paragraph and substituting in place thereof the following:
