PLANTATION OF CHESUNCOOK.

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of Knox are hereby authorized to designate a trustee to hold said sinking fund, which trustee shall be a banking corporation organized under the laws of the state of Maine, having a capital of not less than \$100,000.

Sec. 5. Sinking fund not to be used for other purposes. Money once paid into the sinking fund hereby provided shall not be available for the use of the county for any purpose except for the retirement of the bonds hereinbefore referred to in section I.

Sec. 6. Emergency Clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble this act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 42.

AN ACT Validating the Existing Form of Government of the City of Eastport.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Present form of government of Eastport ratified and validated. The organization and government of the city of Eastport, as provided for and authorized by chapter 156 of the public laws of 1913 is hereby ratified, confirmed and made legal, and all acts done by said city and by all officers purporting to have been elected or appointed as provided in said chapter are hereby declared to be legal and valid; notwithstanding any failure to comply with the provisions of section 36 of said act.

Chapter 43.

AN ACT to Repeal the Organization of the Plantation of Chesuncook.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Chesuncook plantation organization repealed; corporate existence survives for certain purposes. The organization of the plantation of Chesuncook, pursuant to warrant of the commissioners of the county of Piscataquis dated September 6, 1921, is hereby repealed; provided, however, that the corporate existence, powers, duties, and liabilities of said plantation shall survive for the purpose of prosecuting and defending all pending suits and causes of suits to which said plantation is or may be a party, and all needful processes growing out of the same, and for the further purpose of providing for the payment of all or any judgments which may be rendered against said plantation and to pay state, county, and forestry district taxes assessed for the years 1933 and 1934.

ANNUAL MEETING OF TOWN OF SANFORD.

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Sec. 2. Unexpended school funds to be paid to treasurer of state. All funds unexpended for school purposes at the time when this act is effective out of amounts raised by said plantation for school purposes, or out of amounts paid by the state for school purposes, shall be paid by the treasurer of said plantation or such other person in whose custody such funds may be, to the treasurer of state. Such amounts, so received, shall constitute a fund for school purposes, of which the income only shall be expended and applied for the schooling of children resident within the limits of the present plantation.

Chapter 44.

AN ACT Relating to a Road in the Town of Mariaville.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1931, c. 130, repealed. Chapter 130 of the private and special laws of 1931 is hereby repealed.

Chapter 45.

AN ACT to Change the Time for Holding the Annual Town Meeting of the Town of Sanford, York County, Maine, and for Other Purposes.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Annual town meeting. The annual town meeting of the inhabitants of the town of Sanford for the election of all municipal officers, members of committees, members of boards, trustees and commissioners, required by the laws of said state or by vote of the inhabitants of said town to be elected, shall be held on the 1st Monday of December of the year 1933 and the 1st Monday of each succeeding year thereafter; that the 1st Monday of December of the year 1933 and the 1st Monday of December of each succeeding year thereafter shall be designated as the date of the annual town meeting of said town of Sanford, and that the voters thereof shall be warned according to the revised statutes pertaining to towns and the calling and holding of town meetings therein.

Sec. 2. Opening of polls. That the polls for said election shall remain open until 7 P. M., standard time, on the 1st Monday of each December; that upon the close of the polls at 7 P. M., standard time, further business of said annual town meeting shall stand suspended, except for the sorting,
