CHAP. 68

Sec. 17. Limit on age restriction. Any patrolman or matron serving on police force of city of Augusta at the time of passage of this act shall be exempt from the qualifying age restriction of this act.

Sec. 18. Effective date. This act shall not take effect until it has been adopted by the legal voters of the city of Augusta, at the next general election therein, or at a special state election, and if so adopted, the terms of the officers herein provided for, other than said commissioners, shall begin on the 1st Monday of December, 1934.

Chapter 68.**AN ACT Appointing a Commission on Taxation.**

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Appointment of commission on revision of tax laws. There is hereby created a commission on the revision of laws relating to taxation, to be composed of 5 members who shall be appointed as follows: 1 from the senate, by the president thereof, 2 from the house, by the speaker thereof, and 2 others who shall not be members of the 86th legislature, to be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of his council; such commissioners shall serve without pay, but shall be reimbursed for their actual expenses incurred while engaged in the duties of such commission; they shall meet as soon as convenient after their appointment at such place as they select and shall choose 1 of their members to be chairman and they may employ a competent clerk. Such commission shall study and consider the laws relating to taxation and, with the assistance of the revisor of statutes, shall prepare such legislation as they deem advisable for consolidating, revising and amending all laws relating to taxation in the state and the method of assessment and collection thereof.

Sec. 2. Report. Such commission shall, on or before January 1, 1935, make a written report to the governor and council, which report shall be transmitted to the clerk of the house of representatives on the organization of the 87th legislature and shall include such recommendation for legislation as the committee shall adopt with the draft for such legislation as may be suggested.

Sec. 3. Appropriation. The sum of \$1000 is hereby appropriated for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this act.
