Chapter 72.

AN ACT Relating to Trust Fund of the State Military and Naval Children's Home.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Infirmary, construction and equipment of, authorized. The treasurer of state is hereby authorized and empowered to pay such sums as may be necessary up to \$5000, on contracts made by the director of institutional service duly approved by the governor and council, for the construction and equipment of an infirmary at the State Military and Naval Children's Home at Bath. Such amounts as are required by the above mentioned contracts shall be charged against the trust fund of the State Military and Naval Children's Home which is known as the administration fund.

Approved March 31, 1933.

Chapter 73.

AN ACT to Incorporate the Town of Lincoln School District.

Emergency Preamble. Whereas, the school building which houses the free high school of the town of Lincoln was designed to accommodate no more than 75 pupils and there are now over 150 pupils in said building which overcrowds the capacity of said building and the overcrowded condition is dangerous to the health and lives of the students of said school, and

Whereas, it is imperative that action be taken at the earliest possible moment to relieve this dangerous condition, and

Whereas, \$50,000 has been offered to said town of Lincoln as a gift, providing, it shall have completed a new school building for its high school pupils by the beginning of next fall term of said school, and

Whereas, construction should be commenced immediately, and

Whereas, in the opinion of the legislature, these facts render the immediate passage of this act necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and constitute an emergency within the meaning of the constitution, now therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Town of Lincoln school district, incorporated. Subject to the provisions of section 7 hereof, the town of Lincoln shall constitute a body politic and corporate under the name of the "Town of Lincoln School District" for the purpose of acquiring land within the said town for school purposes; erecting, equipping and maintaining on said land a school build-
