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maintain in and along said streets and roads all necessary poles, wires, pipe and apparatus, provided that said structures are so constructed, established and maintained as not unnecessarily to interfere with the public use of said streets or roads.'

Sec. 2. P. & S. L., 1901, c. 489, § 6, amended. Section 6 of chapter 489 of the private and special laws of 1901, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 6. Made to include electric light and power plant. For the purpose of carrying into effect the provisions of this act, the town of Lubec, at a meeting duly called therefor, may as soon as the town comes into ownership, control or management of a system of waterworks and electric lighting and power plant, by building, purchase or otherwise, elect by ballot 3 water and electric light commissioners, the 3 first chosen as aforesaid, shall serve, I for I year, I for 2 years, I for 3 years, and thereafterwards I commissioner shall be elected annually in the month of March to serve for a term of 3 years. Said commissioners are authorized to fix the water and electric light and power rates and determine the conditions and manner of the water and electric light and power supply and shall have the general control and management of the water and electric light and power systems owned by the town. The above commissioners, with such additional commissioners as the town, may from time to time, elect, shall apply the surplus funds arising from said system solely for the purpose of liquidation of the water works and electric light and power loan. They shall receive such compensation for their services as may be fixed by the town.'

Chapter 92.

AN ACT Relating to the Term of Office of Members of the Police Department of the City of Bangor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Members of police department to be retired at age of 65. When any policeman, patrolman, watchman or keeper of the city of Bangor shall have arrived at the age of 65 years he shall be deemed to be incapacitated for further useful service in said department and shall be honorably discharged by the city council.

Sec. 2. Members of police department may be retired at age of 60. Any member of said department over 60 years of age may be retired by the city council upon application of the city manager, bearing the certificate

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of the civil service commission that said member is incapacitated for further useful service in said department.

Sec. 3. Exceptions. Nothing in this act shall be construed to prevent the voluntary retirement of any member of said department at the age of 60, and any member so retiring shall enjoy all the privileges now enjoyed by members of said department heretofore retired at the age of 60.

Chapter 93.

AN ACT Authorizing and Empowering the Register of Deeds for the County of Knox to Make a True Copy of Contents of Volume 24 and of Volume 30 of the Knox County Records of Deeds and to Certify that the Same Are True Copies of Said Records.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. True copy authorized of Knox county records of deeds. The register of deeds for the county of Knox is hereby authorized and empowered to make a true copy of the contents of volume 24 and of volume 30 of the Knox county records of deeds and to certify that the same are true copies of said records.

Sec. 2. Same legal effect as original volumes. When said copies are so made and certified, the records contained therein and certified copies made therefrom shall be received in all courts of law with the same legal effect as those contained in the original volumes.

Sec. 3. Compensation for services. The compensation for such services shall be fixed by county commissioners of said county, and upon an order approved by them shall be paid by the county treasurer.
