162 APPROPRIATING MONEYS FOR ANTICIPATED OVERDRAFTS. CHAP. 122

#### Chapter 122.

AN ACT Appropriating Moneys for Anticipated Overdrafts for Which No Legislative Appropriation Has Been Made, and to Provide for Carrying on the Activities of Departments for the Remaining Months of the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1934 and the Fiscal Year Ending June 30, 1935.

**Emergency preamble.** Whereas, the funds appropriated by the 86th legislature for carrying on certain activities of the state are either exhausted or insufficient in amount to continue such activities for the remaining months of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1934 and the fiscal year ending June 30, 1935, and

Whereas, it is impossible for some of our citizens to maintain themselves, and

Whereas, the laws provide that the support and treatment of these persons is a direct obligation of the state, and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine, and requires the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now therefore

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Emergency appropriations. There is hereby appropriated the following sums from any funds in the treasury:

Aid and Relief	1933-34	1934-35
Pauper support	400,000.00	
Mothers' aid	20,000.00	40,000.00
Soldiers' pensions	15,000.00	
Legislative expense	35,000.00	
Recess tax commission	5,000.00	
Constitutional convention	2,300.00	

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble hereof, this act shall take effect when approved.
