CHAP. 28

That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation prohibiting fishing in the waters of Soper brook, in township 4, Range II, W. E. L. S., Piscataquis county, in Duck pond in said township and in Jordan pond in township 3, Range II, W. E. L. S. in said county, during the months of July and August of each year except in the ordinary way of casting with unbaited artificial flies or fly-fishing so-called.

Chapter 26.

RESOLVE, Relative to the Rules and Regulations on the Fishing for White Perch in Little River in the Towns of Old Orchard Beach and Scarboro in the Counties of York and Cumberland.

Fishing for white perch in Little river, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby authorized to issue a rule and regulation, prohibiting the taking of white perch in Little river in the towns of Old Orchard Beach and Scarboro in the counties of York and Cumberland, except that, they may be taken therefrom with single hook and line for consumption as food in the family of the person taking the same, and that not more than 5 pounds of white perch shall be taken therefrom or had in possession in any I day.

RESOLVE, in Favor of A. L. Dennison, of Wilton.

A. L. Dennison compensated for expenses of trial of his son. Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of \$301.87 to be paid to A. L. Dennison of Wilton to compensate him for money expended in the trial of his son, Harry B. Dennison, former state police officer, who was compelled to defend himself for false arrest in a case where he was acting under direct orders from the secretary of state, to be paid from the registration of motor vehicle funds.

RESOLVE, in Favor of Lawrence Hahn.

Lawrence Hahn compensated for damage done by an escaped convict.

Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$46.17 to be paid to Lawrence Hahn, of Thomaston, to compensate him for the damage caused to his automobile by escaped convicts from the state prison, to be paid from the funds appropriated for the state prison.

RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in DeMyers Brook.

DeMyers brook closed to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to close to all fishing DeMyers brook, in Eastbrook, from its source to Abrom's pond, under the rules and regulations of the department.

RESOLVE, Relating to Ice Fishing in Peters Pond.

Peters pond opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation opening to ice fishing under the general law, Peters pond in the town of Brownville.

Chapter 31.

RESOLVE, in Favor of Henry Moor, of Township No. 28.

Henry Moor, compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$30, to compensate Henry Moor of Township No. 28, for damage done to his turnip crops by deer, to be paid from the appropriation for the maintenance of the department of inland fisheries and game.
