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### Chapter 60.

#### RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Tributaries of Sturtevant Pond.

Tributaries of Sturtevant pond closed to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation closing to all fishing the tributaries to Sturtevant pond, in Magalloway plantation, and also the outlet thereof down to the screen on Pond brook, so-called.

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### Chapter 61.

#### RESOLVE, Opening Crystal Lake to Ice Fishing.

Crystal lake opened to ice fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation opening to ice fishing under the general law, Crystal lake, in the town of Washington.

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### Chapter 62.

#### RESOLVE, Authorizing the Governor to Convey Certain Land in Petersburg, Virginia, to the United States.

**Preamble.** Whereas, the state of Maine, in accordance with the terms of chapter 45 of the resolves of the state of Maine for the year of 1895, accepted the gift of 5 acres of land situated near Petersburg, Virginia, and acquired title thereto, together with a monument standing on said land, from the First Maine Heavy Artillery Association, and

Whereas, an offer has been made on behalf of the Petersburg National Military Park Commission that the government of the United States, if said land and monument are conveyed to it in fee simple, will perpetually maintain said monument and keep said land in suitable condition for park purposes, and

Whereas, in the opinion of this legislature, it is advisable that said offer be accepted

**Park land at Petersburg to be conveyed.** Resolved: That the governor be and hereby is, empowered and directed to convey in fee simple to the United States of America the title of the state of Maine to approximately 5 acres of land situated near Petersburg, Virginia, and contiguous to Petersburg National Military Park, which said land was conveyed to the state under a certain deed given by Horace H. Shaw to said state bearing

date, September 30, 1895, and recorded in the clerk's office of the county court for Prince George county, Virginia, in book 47 at page 29.

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**Chapter 63.**

**RESOLVE, in Favor of George Mawhinney, of Jonesboro.**

George Mawhinney compensated for injuries. **Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$1,000, to be paid to George Mawhinney, of Jonesboro, as settlement in full, for injuries received while in the employ of the state of Maine; said sum to be paid from the general highway funds.

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**Chapter 64.**

**RESOLVE, in Favor of Fort Knox.**

Repair of Fort Knox provided for. **Resolved:** That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$250 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1934, and the sum of \$250 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1935, for repairs on Fort Knox in Prospect, to be paid from the appropriation for old forts and military reservations.

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**Chapter 65.**

**RESOLVE, in Favor of Bernard Andrews, of Canton.**

Bernard Andrews of Canton, compensated. **Resolved:** That there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of \$150 to be paid to Bernard Andrews, of Canton, to compensate him for damage done to his property by beaver, to be paid from appropriation for the maintenance of the department of inland fisheries and game.

**RESOLVE, Granting Teacher's Pension to Miss Nancy Rankin, of Hiram.**

Nancy Rankin; teacher's pension. **Resolved:** That a pension of \$375 per year be and hereby is granted to Nancy Rankin, of Hiram, to be paid
