Chapter 156.

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Anna Foley, of Lewiston.

Pension provided for Anna Foley. Resolved: That a pension of \$20 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Anna Foley, of Lewiston, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Approved March 25, 1933

Chapter 157.

RESOLVE, Providing for an Increase in State Pension for William S. Smith, of Alna.

Pension provided for William S. Smith. Resolved: That a pension of \$20 per month be, and hereby is, granted to William S. Smith, of Alna, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature, and shall be in lieu of the state pension he is now receiving.

Chapter 158.

RESOLVE, Providing for a State Pension for Archibald Mullen, of Washington.

Pension provided for Archibald Mullen. Resolved: That a pension of \$15 per month be, and hereby is, granted to Archibald Mullen, of Washington, to be paid quarterly from the fund for pensions for soldiers and sailors and their dependents. Said pension shall begin July 1st, 1933, and continue until otherwise provided by the legislature.

Chapter 159.

RESOLVE, in Favor of Mary E. Rogers, of Carmel.

Mary E. Rogers, compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$150 to be paid to Mary E. Rogers, of Carmel,

to compensate her for the loss of a horse which was killed due to a defective highway; said sum to be paid from the general highway funds.

Chapter 160.**RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Great Pond, in Belgrade Chain of Lakes.**

Opening Great pond to pickerel and pike fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Great pond in the Belgrade chain of lakes to pickerel and pike fishing for 2 years during the months of January and February, on Saturdays only, for ice fishing.

Chapter 161.**RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Day Mountain Pond, in the Town of Avon.**

Fishing in Day Mountain pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation fixing the daily bag limit on trout to be taken from Day Mountain pond in the town of Avon in the county of Franklin to 15 fish of not less than 7 inches in length.

Chapter 162.**RESOLVE, Relating to Closed Season on Muskrat on the West Branch of the Sebasticook River.**

Muskrat hunting and trapping regulated on the west branch of the Sebasticook river. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation closing the west branch of the Sebasticook river to muskrat hunting and trapping from May 1st to the following March 31st of each year, both days inclusive.
