Chapter 160.

RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Great Pond, in Belgrade Chain of Lakes.

Opening Great pond to pickerel and pike fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Great pond in the Belgrade chain of lakes to pickerel and pike fishing for 2 years during the months of January and February, on Saturdays only, for ice fishing.

Approved March 28, 1933 '

Chapter 161.

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Day Mountain Pond, in the Town of Avon.

Fishing in Day Mountain pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation fixing the daily bag limit on trout to be taken from Day Mountain pond in the town of Avon in the county of Franklin to 15 fish of not less than 7 inches in length.

Chapter 162.

RESOLVE, Relating to Closed Season on Muskrat on the West Branch of the Sebasticook River.

Muskrat hunting and trapping regulated on the west branch of the Sebasticook river. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game is hereby directed to issue a rule and regulation closing the west branch of the Sebasticook river to muskrat hunting and trapping from May 1st to the following March 31st of each year, both days inclusive.

Approved March 28, 1933
