Supplementary to the Resolves passed at the Regular Session
and Special Session of November 14.

Chapter 218.

RESOLVE in Favor of Charles W. Brown of Abbot.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated, the sum of \$500, to be paid to Charles W. Brown of Abbot, to compensate him in full for damages to his land and dam privilege in said Abbot by reason of the construction and maintenance of a bridge on the state highway across the south branch of the Piscataquis river, said sum to be paid from the funds of the state highway department.

Chapter 219.

RESOLVE, Proposing the Repeal of the Twenty-sixth Amendment to the Constitution, Relating to the Manufacture and Sale of Intoxicating Liquors.

Constitutional amendment proposed to repeal the 26th amendment. Resolved: That the 26th amendment to the constitution is hereby repealed.
