CHAP. 76

Sec. 7. School funds withheld from delinquent municipalities. When any state tax assessed upon any city, town or plantation remains unpaid such city, town or plantation is precluded from drawing from the state treasury the school funds set apart for such city, town or plantation, so long as such tax remains unpaid.

Chapter 75.

AN ACT to Acquire the American Portion of the International Bridge at Baring in Washington County, and to Provide for its Maintenance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Authority to sell. The inhabitants of the town of Baring in Washington county and the municipal officers thereof, are hereby authorized to sell, convey and transfer to the state of Maine that portion owned by it and known as the American part of the international wooden bridge across the St. Croix river connecting said Baring with Upper Mills, New Brunswick, including its part of the foundations, superstructure and approaches in consideration of the state accepting the same and hereafter maintaining it as a free public bridge.

Sec. 2. Authority to purchase. Upon the tender of a deed by said municipal officers, the state highway commission shall accept it and thereafter the repair and maintenance of the so-called American portion of said international bridge as a free public bridge shall be assumed and continued by the state under the general control, management and direction of the state highway commission.

Chapter 76.

AN ACT Appropriating Moneys for Anticipated Overdrafts for Which No Legislative Appropriation Has Been Made, and for Obligations for Which No Appropriations Were Made.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the funds appropriated by the 86th legislature for carrying on certain activities of the state are either exhausted or insufficient in amount to continue such activities for the remaining months of the fiscal year ending June 30, 1935, and

Whereas, it is impossible for some of our citizens to maintain themselves, and

Whereas, the laws provide that the support and treatment of these persons is a direct obligation of the state, and

Whereas, there are outstanding unpaid obligations that were legally contracted under existing laws, and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine, and requires the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Emergency appropriations. There is hereby appropriated for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1935 the following sums from any funds in the treasury:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble hereof, this act shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 77.

AN ACT Relating to Tenure of Office of Town Manager of Fort Fairfield.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Tenure of office of town manager of Fort Fairfield. Section 8 of chapter 65 of the private and special laws of 1929 is hereby amended by striking out all of said section and inserting the following in place thereof:

'Sec. 8. Tenure of office. All appointed officers and voters shall hold office at the pleasure of the appointing power, except those of town manager
