Chapter 15

AN ACT Relating to Practice of Optometry Defined.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 21, § 48, amended. The last paragraph of section 48 of chapter 21 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'An ophthalmic lens within the meaning of this and the following section shall be any lens which has a spherical, cylindrical, or prismatic power or value, ~~and~~ ~~or any lens is~~ ground pursuant to a prescription.'

Chapter 16

AN ACT Relating to Clerk Hire in County Offices of Androscoggin County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 125, § 46, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 46 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Androscoggin county: for clerks in the office of register of deeds, \$1800; for clerks in the office of register of probate, \$1200; for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, ~~twelve hundred dollars~~ \$2000; for clerks in the office of sheriff, \$600.'

Chapter 17

AN ACT Relative to Non-resident Guides.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 16, amended. The third paragraph of section 16 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'A fee of \$3 shall be paid annually for the registration of a Class A guide and a fee of \$1 shall be paid annually for a Class B guide. Non-residents may be so licensed ~~for restricted areas~~ upon payment of a fee of \$20.'

AN ACT Relative to Possession of Fishing Gear.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 20, repealed. Section 20 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed.

Chapter 19

AN ACT Relative to Hunting, Definition of.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 40, ¶ "a", amended. Paragraph "a" of section 40 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Hunting means to hunt for, pursue, catch, take, kill, wound, or destroy wild birds and animals.'

Chapter 20

AN ACT Relative to Revocation of Hunting Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 41, ¶ 6-A, amended. Paragraph 6-A of section 41 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'6-A. The hunting license of any person who, while in pursuit of wild game or game birds, shoots, kills or wounds a human being, through mistaking a human being for wild game or wild birds, shall be revoked im-
