shall not sell or deliver any blank writs or precepts bearing the seal of said courts and the signature of said judges, ~~clerks~~, recorders, registers and trial justices, to any person except one who has been admitted as an attorney and counselor at law, and solicitor and counselor in chancery in accordance with the laws of this state, and said judges and registers of said probate courts shall not receive any paper, petition, or other instrument pertaining to the practice of law before said probate courts unless it bears the endorsement of an attorney or counselor at law, duly authorized to practice before said courts, except, that the above provisions shall not apply to a party in interest in the subject matter in said courts.'

Approved April 9, 1937.

Chapter 147

AN ACT Relating to Business Hours for State Stores.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 300, § 9, amended. Section 9 of chapter 300 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 9. Business hours for state stores. State stores shall not be open on Sundays, court holidays or on the day of the holding of a general election or state-wide primary or between the hours of 7 P. M. and 9 A. M., except on Saturdays when, if open, they may be kept open until 10 P. M., and the liquor commission is hereby authorized to regulate the opening and closing hours of each store within the provisions of this act.

No sales shall be made therein to minors, or persons under the influence of liquor.'

Chapter 148

AN ACT Relating to Open Season on Fur-Bearing Animals.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 72, amended. Sub-paragraph (a) of section 72 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'(a) There shall be a perpetual closed season on hunting or trapping
