CHAP. 11

4,734 feet, Piscataquis county, Maine, in the northeast corner of Baxter State Park, T. 3, R. 9, about 2 miles north of Baxter Peak on Mount Katahdin, near latitude 45° 56' 10" N., longitude 68° 55' 20" W., formerly known as North Peaks, are hereby named Howe Peaks in memory of Burton W. Howe 1874-1922 of Patten, Maine, and the Spring of Water lying on the southwest portion of Baxter State Park where the Hunt and Abol trails come together on the Katahdin plateau is hereby named Thoreau Spring in honor of Henry David Thoreau 1817-1862 who climbed the mountain in 1846 and wrote the first authentic description of the great forest regions of Maine, and the said Peaks and Spring shall hereafter be designated Howe Peaks and Thoreau Spring on the official maps and records of the state.

Chapter 11

RESOLVE, Assenting to the Provisions of the Bankhead-Jones Act, So-called.

Whereas, there has been enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, "An Act to provide for research into basic laws and principles relating to agriculture and to provide for the further development of cooperative agricultural extension work and the more complete endowment and support of land-grant colleges," approved June 29, 1935, the act of Congress known as Public No. 182-74th Congress, and

Whereas, the provisions of the said act and the purpose of the grants of money authorized by the act are made subject to the legislative assent of the several states and territories, therefore, be it

Bankhead-Jones act, accepted. Resolved: That the state of Maine hereby assents to the provisions and requirements of the act of Congress known as Public No. 182-74th Congress, and that the trustees of the University of Maine be, and hereby are, authorized and empowered to receive the grants of money appropriated under said act, and to cooperate with the federal government under the terms of said act.
