Chapter 43

RESOLVE, Relating to Atlantic Salmon Fishing in Certain Waters.

Fishing for Atlantic salmon in certain waters, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation closing all waters and their tributaries, southwest of a line drawn between Leighton Point, so-called, in Pembroke, and Denbow Point, so-called, in Lubec, to fishing for Atlantic salmon except by customary means of rod and reel.

Approved April 5, 1937.

Chapter 44

RESOLVE, Relating to Digging for Clams in Certain Waters.

Digging for clams in waters adjacent to Lubec, Trescott, Edmunds, and Whiting, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that no person, firm or corporation shall dig clams for commercial purposes within the waters adjacent to the towns of Lubec, Trescott, Edmunds and Whiting; unless they have been resident in one of the respective towns for at least 6 months.

Non-residents may take such clams up to 1 bushel per day.

Whoever violates any of the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100, or by imprisonment for not more than 60 days.

Chapter 45

RESOLVE, Relating to Taking of Clams in Milbridge.

Taking clams in Milbridge, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation forbidding any person not a resident of the town of Milbridge, in the county of Washington, to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of said town. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
