Chapter 60

RESOLVE, Designating a Certain Road as "Douglas Highway."

"Douglas Highway," designated. Resolved: That the road leading from route 1 in the town of Ellsworth in a southerly direction through the town of Lamoine to a point at or near Lamoine Beach, so-called, be and hereby is, designated as "Douglas Highway."

Chapter 61

RESOLVE, Relating to Fishing in Walker's Pond in Brooksville and Sargentville.

Certain fish to be removed from Walker's pond. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized to

remove from Walker's pond in the town of Brooksville and Sargentville all fish except trout and salmon.

Chapter 62

RESOLVE, for Screening the Outlet of Lower Shin Pond in Penobscot County.

Lower Shin pond; screening of. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1500 to be taken from the appropriation for the maintenance of the department of inland fisheries and game, to aid in the screening of Lower Shin pond, in the county of Penobscot; provided however that said appropriation shall not be available until some responsible person, association or town shall have raised and made available any additional amount which may be necessary for the completion of this screen beyond the sum named herein and provided further, that said appropriation shall not be available until some responsible person, corporation, or incorporated fish and game club, or the town in which the outlet of the lake above mentioned is situated, or some other town in the county of Penobscot, in which said waters are situated shall have agreed to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of the water through the same.

Chapter 63

RESOLVE, Relating to Establishment of Feeding Station at Brownfield.

Feeding station at Brownfield, establishment of. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, be and hereby is, authorized to conduct a survey at or near Brownfield, in the county of Oxford, and if in his judgment suitable water be found, to build thereon a feeding station for the propagation of fish.

Chapter 64

RESOLVE, Relative to Fishing in Cumberland, Knox and York Counties.

Fishing in Cumberland, Knox and York counties, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation fixing the opening date for fishing in Cumberland, Knox and York counties to be April 1st each year.
