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**CHAP. 97**

define its authority; and to consider the feasibility of legislation in regard to collective bargaining and necessary procedural legislation.

Said committee shall consider and study similar laws existing in other states and countries and determine, so far as possible, the success experienced thereunder.

Said committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the 89th legislature and in the event that said committee finds it desirable that such legislation be enacted it shall draft a bill or bills for that purpose and have same presented to the 89th legislature.

Members of said committee shall receive their actual expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties as members thereof, said expenses to be approved by the governor and council, but such sum is not to exceed, however, the sum of \$500.

## Chapter 96

### RESOLVE, Authorizing the Sale of State's Interest in Certain Lands.

**Sale of certain state lands, authorized. Resolved:** That the forest commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized to sell and convey to actual settlers thereon certain lands in Webster plantation, in Penobscot county, constituting part of the public lots of said plantation, if he deems it advisable. The said commissioner shall decide the acreage to be sold, the price per acre and the terms of payment; provided that the proceeds of any sales made shall be added to the school fund of said plantation.

## Chapter 97

### RESOLVE, Relating to the Taking of Clams in Bar Harbor, and Lamoine.

**Taking of clams in Bar Harbor, regulated. Resolved:** That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that it shall be unlawful for any person not a resident of or riparian owner in the town of Bar Harbor, in the county of Hancock, to dig clams for commercial purposes within the limits of said town. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and be it further

**Resolved:** That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation that it shall be unlawful

for any person to dig clams for commercial purposes within and from the Jordan River Mussel Beds to the mouth of Berry's Cove, at Berry's Point and on the Marlboro side, beginning at Old Point, along the shore including mussel beds to the town line on the Skillings river, all in the town of Lamoine; provided, however, that any person may take not exceeding  $\frac{1}{2}$  bushel of clams from said territory in any 1 day for home, or immediate consumption. Any person taking clams contrary to the provisions of this rule and regulation shall be punished for each offense by a fine of not more than \$25, or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

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## Chapter 98

### RESOLVE, for Screening Certain Waters in Hancock County.

**Waters in Hancock county; screening of. Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to screen the outlet of Abrams pond in Eastbrook, county of Hancock; provided that said screen shall not be installed until some responsible person, corporation, or incorporated fish and game club, or the town in which the outlet of the lake above mentioned is situated, or some other town in the county of Hancock, in which said waters are situated shall have agreed to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of the water through the same; and be it further

**Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized to move or remove the screen at the outlet of Tunk lake in the county of Hancock; and be it further

**Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized to move the screen at the outlet of Donnell's pond in the county of Hancock.

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## Chapter 99

### RESOLVE, for Screening Certain Lakes and Ponds in the State.

**Appropriation for screening certain lakes and ponds. Resolved:** That the sum of \$3136.19 be, and hereby is, appropriated, to be taken from the appropriation for the maintenance of the department of inland fisheries and game, to be expended by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, to
