Chapter 142

RESOLVE, in Favor of Anton R. Jordan, of Osborne Plantation.

Anton R. Jordan; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$45 to be paid to Anton R. Jordan, of Osborne Plantation, as a full and final settlement against the state for damages to his blueberry field caused by bears and deer; said sum to be paid from the funds of the department of inland fisheries and game.

Chapter 143

RESOLVE, in Favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc., for Support and Maintenance of "Montpelier."

Knox Memorial Association, Inc., appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc., the sum of \$1000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1938, and the sum of \$1000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1939, to aid in the support and maintenance of "Montpelier," replica of the home of Major General Henry Knox, located at Thomaston, Maine. By this appropriation it is not understood to encourage future financial aid.

Chapter 144

RESOLVE, in Favor of Manzie I. Rogers, of Bangor, Maine.

Manzie I. Rogers, compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$1500 to be paid to Manzie I. Rogers, of Bangor, as a full and final settlement for all claims against the state for materials and machinery furnished on concrete highway N.B.M. 91-E, in Brewer, Maine; said sum to be paid from the general highway funds.

Chapter 145

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Propagation of Lobsters, Shad, etc.

Rearing station for propagation of lobsters, shad, etc., established. Resolved: That the sum of \$20,000 be, and hereby is, appropriated for the purpose of establishing a lobster hatchery and rearing station for the

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propagation of lobsters, shad and other salt water fish; the same to be expended under the direction of the department of sea and shore fisheries.

Chapter 146

RESOLVE, in Favor of Appropriating Money for the Maintenance, Supervision and Use of State Parks.

Maintenance of park areas; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, the sum of \$7,500 for the fiscal year 1937-1938, and \$7,500 for the fiscal year 1938-1939, to be expended under the direction of the governor and council for the maintenance, supervision and use of the park areas under the jurisdiction of the state park commission, if and when, upon the approval of the governor and council, said park areas shall be conveyed to the state of Maine by the United States government, or other park areas that may be acquired by said commission.

Chapter 147

RESOLVE, Relative to the Participation by the State of Maine in the New York World's Fair to be held in the Year Nineteen Hundred and Thirty-nine.

Participation in New York World's Fair. Resolved: That for the purpose of exhibiting the recreational advantages, arts, industries, institutions, resources, products and general development of the state of Maine at the New York World's Fair to be held in the year 1939, the Maine Development Commission shall act as the Maine commission for the New York World's Fair. The said commission shall have charge of the interests of the state and its citizens in the preparation and exhibition at the said fair of the natural and industrial products of the state and of objects illustrating its history, progress, moral and material welfare and plans for its future development, and of all other matters relating to said fair. The commission shall communicate with the officers of the fair and shall obtain and disseminate throughout the state all necessary information regarding the fair, and in general shall have and exercise full authority in relation to the participation of the state and its citizens in the fair.
