CHAP. 80

Chapter 78

AN ACT Relating to Knox County Game Preserve.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 90, amended. The paragraph relating to the Knox County Game Preserve in section 90 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby repealed.

Approved March 16, 1939.

Chapter 79

AN ACT Relating to Taxation of Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 12, § 98, amended. Section 98 of chapter 12 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 98. Collector in adjacent town or city to make collecton in unincorporated places. The collector of taxes of any adjacent town or the city treasurer of any adjacent city shall receive the excise tax and issue the receipt prescribed therefor under this chapter to persons residing in unorganized places in any county. Such fee shall be for the use of the town in which such tax is paid. The collector shall be allowed a fee of 15c for each tax receipt issued, and the remainder shall be remitted monthly to the county treasurer to be added to the road repair tax fund for the unorganized township in which the taxpayer resides.'

Chapter 80

AN ACT Relating to the Labelling of Fresh Eggs for Sale.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. P. L., 1937, c. 100, § 3, amended. Section 3 of chapter 100 of the public laws of 1937 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 3. Other definitions and terms. Terms used in this act shall be construed as follows unless a different meaning is clearly apparent from the language or context: "persons" means any person, firm, partnership.
