Chapter 195

AN ACT Prohibiting Trapping in the Town of Scarboro.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, additional. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 72-B and to read as follows:

'Sec. 72-B. Trapping prohibited in the town of Scarboro; exceptions. Trapping for all animals is hereby prohibited in the town of Scarboro in the county of Cumberland, except that the provisions of this section shall not prohibit trapping on any of the salt marshes therein.'

Chapter 196

AN ACT Relative to Bird Sanctuary in Old Orchard Beach.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 90, amended. Section 90 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto, after the second paragraph thereof, the following:

'Old Orchard Beach; no person shall, except as herein provided, at any time, hunt, pursue, shoot at, molest or kill any bird, within the following described territory situated in the town of Old Orchard Beach: beginning at a point on the easterly side of the Old Salt road where the same intersects the Boston and Maine railroad right-of-way; thence south to the athletic field, thence westerly along the northwesterly boundary of the athletic field, thence southerly along its westerly boundary, thence westerly to the edge of the salt marsh, thence southwesterly along the edge of the salt marsh to the mouth of Goose Fare brook, thence at right angles and easterly and parallel with the Atlantic ocean and 50 feet in front of all bulkheads and houses fronting on the beach to the easterly side of Tunis avenue, thence northwesterly along said avenue to the Boston and Maine railroad right-of-way, thence by said Boston and Maine right-of-way to point of beginning.'
