Chapter 27

AN ACT to Permit Charles Hayden Foundation to Be and Become a Limited Partner in Hayden, Stone & Co. and to Authorize said Firm to Conduct Business under Said Name.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Charles Hayden Foundation, special provision for. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 44 of the revised statutes of 1930, Charles Hayden Foundation, a corporation duly created by chapter 588 of the laws of 1937 of the state of New York, is hereby granted permission within this state to be and become a limited partner in the firm of Hayden, Stone & Co., a limited partnership organized under the laws of New York, or in any successor firm so organized, with the limited liability provided for in said laws, which firm or successor firm is hereby authorized to conduct business in this state under said name of Hayden, Stone & Co.

Chapter 28

AN ACT Relating to the Town Manager Form of Government for the Town of Dover-Foxcroft.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. & S. L., 1937, c. 57, § 2, amended. Section 2 of chapter 57 of the private and special laws of 1937 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 2. Election of officers. (a) At such meetings the voters shall choose by ballot as hereinafter provided 7 ~~inhabitants~~ legal voters of said town to be selectmen who shall be ex officio, assessors of taxes and overseers of the poor; a town clerk; a town treasurer; and a superintending school committee of 3. All other necessary town officers, including a town manager, shall be appointed by the selectmen, as herein provided.

(b) Board of selectmen. ~~At the 1st annual town meeting held under the provisions of this act and at each annual meeting thereafter only the necessary number of members of the board shall be elected as may be required to maintain the full number of 7; those elected to fill interim vacancies to serve only for the unexpired term of their predecessors, others for a term of 3 years.
