Sec. 20. Existing statutes not affected; rights conferred subject to provisions of law. Nothing herein contained is intended to repeal, or shall be construed as repealing, the whole or any part of any existing statute, and all the rights and duties herein mentioned shall be exercised and performed in accordance with all the applicable provisions of chapter 62 of the revised statutes, and all acts amendatory thereof or additional thereto.

### Chapter 95

#### AN ACT Relating to the Western Hancock Municipal Court.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. & S. L., 1893, c. 613, § 20, amended. Section 20 of chapter 613 of the private and special laws of 1893, as amended by chapter 26 of the private and special laws of 1919, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 20. Salary of judge increased. From and after July 1, 1919 the judge of said court shall receive as compensation an annual salary of \$750, to be paid monthly from the treasury of the county of Hancock together with actual expenses incurred by him in the trial of criminal cases in any town other than that in which said judge may reside; and in addition thereto said judge shall receive for every blank writ signed by him, 5c; for entry of each civil action, sixty cents 5oc; taxing costs and recording judgment, 25c; writ of execution or possession, 15c. The judge shall receive for every warrant issued by him, \$1, which together with all costs and fines received by him in criminal cases shall, within 60 days after receipt thereof, be by him paid into the treasury of the county of Hancock. Two hundred and fifty dollars per year shall be allowed monthly for the expense of maintaining a court room, paying for janitor service and clerical expense incident to the conduction of said court to be paid from the treasury of the county of Hancock.'
