the state historian shall be paid from the state treasury as provided for in section 6 of chapter 3 of the revised statutes.

- Sec. 3. Topographic mapping, suspended. For a period of 2 years from the date of approval of this act, there shall be no appropriation made for the topographic mapping of the state as provided in sections 21 and 22 of chapter 2 of the revised statutes except such appropriation as may be provided for in "An Act to Promote Topographic Mapping of Maine in Cooperation with the United States Geological Survey" enacted by the 89th legislature.
- Sec. 4. Appropriation for abolishment of grade crossings, suspended. For a period of 2 years from the date of approval of this act, the state shall make no appropriations and no expenditures under the provisions of sections 39 to 42, inclusive, of chapter 27 of the revised statutes, as amended by section 2 of chapter 266 of the public laws of 1931, regarding the abolishment of grade crossings on state aid and third-class highways. Provided, however, if federal funds shall be made available to the state for the abolishment or alteration of railroad and highway crossings on state aid and third-class highways, the state highway commission is authorized to use general highway funds for surveys, plans, land damage and other items of cost, for which federal funds cannot be used.

Chapter 99

AN ACT Authorizing Peabody Law School to Confer Degrees.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Peabody Law School authorized to confer degrees. Peabody Law School, a corporation located in Portland in the county of Cumberland, shall have power and authority to confer the degree of bachelor of laws upon all persons who shall, having had not less than 2 years of college training, have completed satisfactorily at least a 3 years' course in law in said school.
