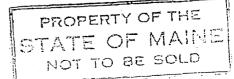

CHAP. 119

Chapter 119

AN ACT Appropriating Moneys for Overdrafts Already Incurred Due to Insufficient Appropriations and Anticipated Overdrafts and Other Obligations for Which no Legislative Appropriations Have Been Made.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, the funds appropriated for the support of certain dependent persons for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1940, are insufficient and an operating deficit exists; and

Whereas, certain other appropriations for carrying on the activities of state government are likewise exhausted; and

Whereas, there are outstanding unpaid obligations which were legally contracted for under existing laws; and

Whereas, existing statutes provide for the support and treatment of certain persons as a direct obligation of the state; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Emergency appropriations. In order to provide for the necessary expenditures of government for the fiscal years ending June 30, 1940, and June 30, 1941, the following sums or as much thereof as shall severally be found necessary, as designated in the following tabulations, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the treasury not otherwise obligated and, in addition thereto, there is hereby appropriated from the sinking fund reserve to general funds of the state the sum of \$225,000.00 and be it further provided that the appropriation for the support of paupers shall be deemed a carrying account during the life of this act:

Chapter 120

AN ACT Authorizing a Bond Issue for Military Expenses.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, recent events have shown that all nations desirous of safety and independence must be adequately and immediately prepared for war in order to protect their sovereignty; and

Whereas, the state of Maine has not provided for the minimum of essential peace time national guard provisions; and

Whereas, recent events have shown that speed is the essence of modern war; and

Whereas, Maine must provide immediately funds to properly house
