LAYING OF COUNTY TAX IN ANDROSCOGGIN FOR 1939

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house, which committee shall be known as the "Committee on the Eastern State Normal School." Said committee shall meet as soon as convenient after appointment and organize by electing a chairman and secretary.

Said committee shall investigate and consider the possibilities of using the plant at the Eastern State Normal School at Castine for desirable purposes of education of youth other than the training of teachers, said committee to report its recommendations to the 90th legislature.

Members of said committee shall receive their actual expenses only, which may be incurred in the discharge of their duties as members thereof, said expenses to be approved by the governor and council. Such expenses shall not exceed, however, the sum of \$100.

Chapter 48

RESOLVE, in Favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc., for Support and Maintenance of "Montpelier."

Knox Memorial Association, Inc., appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of Knox Memorial Association, Inc., the sum of \$1000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1940, and the sum of \$1000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1941, to aid in the support and maintenance of "Montpelier," replica of the home of Major General Henry Knox, located at Thomaston, Maine. By this appropriation it is not intended to encourage future financial aid.

Chapter 49

RESOLVE, for the Laying of the County Tax in the County of Androscoggin for the year 1939.

Emergency preamble. Whereas, an unnecessary increase was made in the estimates for the necessary taxes for the county of Androscoggin, and

Whereas, it is vital, and imperative that every saving be made that is possible to the taxpayer, and

Whereas, an emergency resolve has been signed by the governor that apportions the tax to the county of Androscoggin in an account in excess of its needs, and

BETHEL REIMBURSED

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Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of section 16 of Article XXXI of the constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore, be it

Previous county tax of Androscoggin repealed. Resolved: That so much of the "Resolve for the Laying of the County Taxes for the year 1939" approved on March 29, 1939 as relates to Androscoggin county is hereby repealed, and be it further

Androscoggin county; appropriation for. Resolved: That the sum of \$125,000 is hereby granted as a tax on the county of Androscoggin to be appropriated, assessed, collected, and applied to the purpose of paying the debts and necessary expenses of said county, and for other purposes of law for the year 1939.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency recited in the preamble, this resolve shall take effect when approved.

Chapter 50

RESOLVE, Naming "Perleys Pond."

"Perleys Pond"; named. Resolved: That a certain pond, located in the town of Denmark, county of Oxford, on the east side of the Bridgton and Saco river railroad at a point called Perleys Mills, shall be hereafter known as "Perleys Pond."

Approved April 1, 1939.

Chapter 51

RESOLVE, to Reimburse the Town of Bethel for the Fighting of Fire in Unorganized Township of Albany.

Town of Bethel, reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated, in favor of the town of Bethel, the sum of \$150 as a full and final settlement against the state for expenses and use of equipment in the fighting of fire in the unorganized township of Albany; said sum to be paid from the general state funds.

Approved April 6, 1939.

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
