or some other town in the county in which said waters are situated, shall have, in legal town meeting, and having an article in the warrant for said town meeting for that purpose, by vote of record, vote to assume all liability for the keeping of said screen at all times free from sticks, leaves and all debris, so that the same will not become clogged and prevent the free running of water through the same.

#### Chapter 69

RESOLVE, Appropriating Money for Drilling Artesian Wells in the Town of Perry.

Artesian wells at Pleasant Point Reservation. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$1000 to be expended under the direction of the department of health and welfare for the drilling of 1 to 3 artesian wells in Pleasant Point Reservation in the town of Perry; said sum to be paid from the general funds.

Approved April 18, 1939.

### Chapter 70

RESOLVE, Relative to the Purchase of Land Adjoining Land of the State Military Department, at Augusta, Known as Camp Keyes.

Purchase of certain property, authorized. Resolved: That the governor and council be, and hereby are, authorized to purchase certain parcels of land, to wit: I parcel located on the westerly side of Blaine Avenue in the city of Augusta, and I parcel located on the northerly side of Western Avenue in the city of Augusta; both parcels being adjacent to property owned by the state and occupied for military and aviation purposes and known as Camp Keyes. The price and terms shall be fixed by the governor and council, and payment shall be made from funds not otherwise appropriated.
