the Social Security Board for the proper administration of this act, it is the policy of this state that such moneys shall be replaced by moneys appropriated for such purpose from the general funds of this state to the Unemployment Compensation Administration Fund for expenditure as provided in subsection (a) of this section. Upon receipt of notice of such a finding by the Social Security Board the commissioner shall promptly report the amount required for such replacement to the governor and the governor shall at the earliest opportunity submit to the legislature a request for the appropriation of such amount. This subsection shall not be construed to relieve this state of its obligation with respect to funds received prior to July 1, 1941, pursuant to the provisions of title III of the Social Security Act.'

Chapter 114

AN ACT Amending the Law Relating to Unemployment Compensation by Repealing a Part of Section 5.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1935, c. 192, § 5, sub-§ (e), ¶ (3), repealed. Paragraph (3) of subsection (e) of section 5 of chapter 192 of the public laws of 1935, as amended, is hereby repealed.

Chapter 115

AN ACT Amending the Law Relating to Unemployment Compensation to Reduce Benefits When Claimed Fraudulently.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1935, c. 192, § 5, additional. Section 5 of chapter 192 of the public laws of 1935, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new subsection (f), to read as follows:

'(f) For any week for which he is found to have filed a claim fraudulently to obtain benefits to which he is not entitled, and his maximum benefit amount shall be reduced by an amount equivalent to the number of such weeks of disqualification times his weekly benefit amount.'
