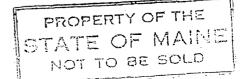

Chapter 126

AN ACT Relating to Warrants Posted in Wards in Cities and in Towns.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 5, § 8, amended. Section 8 of chapter 5 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 8. Sections 4, 5, 6, and 7, applicable to cities and towns. Sections 4, 5, 6, and 7 apply to cities and the municipal officers of cities, and the same as to towns, and the selectmen of towns, and when any meeting thus provided for is ealled in cities, and in towns with more than one voting precinct, it shall be by warrants posted in each ward in cities, and in each voting precinct in towns.'

Chapter 127

AN ACT Relating to Referendum Ballots.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 8, § 16, amended. Section 16 of chapter 8 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 16. How voters shall prepare ballot; manner of voting. On receipt of his ballot the voter shall forthwith, and without leaving the enclosed space, retire alone to one of the voting shelves or compartments so provided and shall prepare his ballot by marking in the appropriate place a cross (X) as follows: He may place such mark within the square above the name of the party group or ticket, in which case he shall be deemed to have voted for all the persons named in the group under such party or designation. And if the voter shall desire to vote for any person or persons, whose name or names are not printed as candidates in such party group or ticket, he may erase any name or names which are printed therein and place a cross (X) in the square at the right of the name of the candidate of his choice in any other party group or ticket. Or, as an optional method of voting, the voter may omit the cross (X) in the party square and place a cross (X) in the blank square at the right of the name of each candidate he wishes to vote for. If the voter wishes to vote for a candidate whose name is not on the ballot he may write the name under the name of
