Sec. 2. R. S., c. 19, § 210, ¶ III, repealed. Paragraph III of section 210 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed.

Chapter 152

AN ACT Relating to Aid to Needy Children.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1937, c. 177, § 1, amended. That part designated "(b)" of section 1 of chapter 177 of the public laws of 1937 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'(b) The term "dependent child" wherever used in this act shall be construed to mean a needy child under the age of 16, or under the age of 18 if found by the state agency to be regularly attending school, who has been deprived of parental support or care by reason of the death, continued absence from home, or the physical or mental incapacity of a parent and who is living with his father, mother, grandfather, grandmother, brother, sister, stepfather, stepmother, stepbrother, stepsister, uncle or aunt in a place of residence maintained by 1 or more of such relatives as his or their own home;'

Chapter 153

AN ACT Relative to Trapping of Bobcats in Aroostook County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 72, ¶ (i), amended. Paragraph (i) of section 72 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'(i). Provided, further, that there shall be a closed season on trapping

wild animals from May ~~1st~~ 15th to October 15th, of each year, both days inclusive, except as hereinbefore provided in paragraph (c) of this section, provided, however, that it shall be lawful to trap bobcats in Aroostook county from October 15th to June 15th, both days inclusive.'

Chapter 154

AN ACT Relative to Training of Fox, Coon or Rabbit Hounds.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 72, additional. Section 72 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto at the end thereof a new paragraph to read as follows:

'(k) Fox, coon or rabbit hounds may be trained on foxes, coons and rabbits from September 1st to October 15th, if under the personal supervision of the owner at all times.'

Chapter 155

AN ACT Relative to Field Trials and Training Bird or Coon Dogs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 55-A, additional. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 55-A and to read as follows:

'Sec. 55-A. Field trials permitted for bird dogs or coon dogs. It shall be lawful to hold bird dog or coon dog field trials at any time. During the field trials permitted in this section, no person shall use any firearm other than a pistol loaded with blank ammunition.'
