Chapter 156

AN ACT Relative to Revocation of Hunting and Fishing Licenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 43, amended. The first three paragraphs of section 43 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, are hereby repealed and the following inserted in place thereof:

'Upon conviction of any person holding a license or licenses under the provisions of this chapter, as revised, of any violation of sections 9-B, 15, 17, 26, 27, 28, 44, 45, 46, 46-A, 47, 48, 49, 59, 60, 61, 61-A, 62, 63, 64, 66, 69, 73, 81, 91, 92, 93, 94, 95, the commissioner shall revoke the license issued such person to carry on the particular activity in which he was engaged at the time of such violation, for the period of one year from the date when notified of said conviction as hereinafter provided.

On conviction of any person holding a license or licenses issued under the provisions of this chapter, as revised, of the violation of any of the sections of this chapter not hereinbefore mentioned or of any rules or regulations of the commissioner, the commissioner may revoke any license or licenses held by such person for a period of not less than three months nor more than one year from the date when notified of said conviction as hereinafter provided.

Any person whose license or licenses has been revoked under the provisions of the second paragraph of this section may request a hearing by the commissioner, at which hearing all the facts concerning the violation shall be presented and the license or licenses may be returned by the commissioner if he finds the best interests of conservation are served thereby.'

Chapter 157

AN ACT Relating to Physical Education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 19, § 183, amended. Section 183 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 183. Reimbursement to towns for expenses incurred in employment of directors. Whenever the superintendent of schools of any town shall certify under oath to the commissioner of education according to a

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form prescribed by him that a director or supervisor of physical education has been employed for the school year preceding, then upon approval of such certificate by the commissioner of education, reimbursement from state or federal funds shall be paid to the amount of $\frac{1}{2}$ the salary paid, not to exceed ~~\$800~~ \$600 for each director or supervisor in any 1 year, and not to exceed ~~\$1600~~ \$1200 to any one town; provided, that the appropriation made by the town for this purpose shall be exclusive of any other sum received from the state for the support of common schools and of the minimum requirement raised by the town as prescribed by section 16. Two or more towns adjacent to each other, or the several towns of a superintendence union, may co-operate in the employment of directors or supervisors of physical education and may apportion the cost of the same among the several towns of the group according to the amount of time given to each.'

Chapter 158

AN ACT Relating to Payment of the Special Tax for Investigation of Fires by the Insurance Commissioner.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 35, § 55, amended. Section 55 of chapter 35 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 2 of the public laws of 1939, is hereby further amended by adding thereto a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Whenever there shall accumulate in the special fund created by this section a surplus sufficient to defray the expenses of such investigations and inspections for an ensuing period of 1 year, then, in the discretion of the insurance commissioner, the foregoing special tax for that year may be omitted.'

Chapter 159

AN ACT Providing for Financing of Mutual Insurance Companies.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 60, § 36, amended. Section 36 of chapter 60 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof a new paragraph to read as follows:
