of that year, the commissioner of education shall pay such accounts, or so much thereof as he shall find to be rightly due, to the receiving city, town, or plantation, at the next regular annual apportionment, together with interest on such accounts at the rate of 6% annually, computed from said 1st day of September and the commissioner of education shall charge any such payment against the apportioned fund of the sending city, town, or plantation.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 19, § 210, ¶ VI, repealed. Paragraph VI of section 210 of chapter 19 of the revised statutes, as enacted by chapter 33 of the public laws of 1935, is hereby repealed.

Chapter 169

AN ACT Relative to Daily Limit on Pickerel.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 25, additional. Chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be numbered 25 and to read as follows:

'Sec. 25. Daily limit on pickerel. No person shall take, catch or kill more than 10 pickerel in any one day. No person shall have in possession more than 10 pickerel taken, caught or killed in any one day. Provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall not apply in Washington county.'

Chapter 170

AN ACT Relating to Absentee Ballots.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 9, § 6, amended. Section 6 of chapter 9 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

'For the purpose of this section, the clerk of any city or town within this state hereby is authorized to administer the oath required under this section.'
