Chapter 299

AN ACT to Assist Rural Sanitation Activities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1937, c. 149, amended. That part designated "Sec. 183-M" of chapter 149 of the public laws of 1937 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following:

'but such rules, regulations and ordinances shall not apply to privately owned premises to which neither public water nor sewerage service is available, provided that neither entertainment, meals nor lodging be furnished the public thereon and that the disposal of sewerage therefrom may not drain into any stream or body of water designated by the state bureau of health as a public water supply.'

Chapter 300

AN ACT Relating to the Administration of State Institutions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. P. L., 1939, c. 223, § 3, amended. Section 3 of chapter 223 of the public laws of 1939 is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 3. Qualifications. The commissioner of institutional service shall be a person experienced in institutional administration, either as a superintendent, chief medical officer or business manager, or who has had other satisfactory experience in the direction of work of a comparable nature. Said commissioner shall have the power to appoint institutional heads and such other employees as shall be necessary for the proper performance of the duties of said department, said appointments to be with the approval of the governor and council.'

Sec. 2. P. L., 1939, c. 223, § 4, amended. The second sentence in the second paragraph of section 4 of chapter 223 of the public laws of 1939 is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'The heads or superintendents of the several said institutions under the department shall report directly to the said commissioner.'
