Chapter 313

AN ACT Relating to Gambling.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 136, § 11, amended. The 1st sentence of section 11 of chapter 136 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'No person shall travel from town to town, or from place to place, in any city, town, or plantation, on foot or by private or public conveyance, either by land or water, carrying, or having have in his actual or constructive possession, or storing, any punch board, seal card, slot gambling machine, or other implements, apparatus, or materials of any form of gambling, and no person shall solicit, obtain, or offer to obtain orders for the sale or delivery of any punch board, seal card, slot gambling machine, or other implements, apparatus, or material of gambling machine, or other implements, apparatus, or material of gambling.'

Chapter 314

AN ACT Providing That the State of Maine May Become a Party to the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Compact.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Governor to execute compact with other states. The governor of this state is hereby authorized and directed to execute a compact on behalf of the state of Maine with any one or more of the states of New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island, New York, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina,
