## Chapter 12

### RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Sand Pond.

Fishing in Sand pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, be and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Sand pond in Denmark, county of Oxford, to ice fishing for pickerel from the time the ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring.

Approved February 24, 1941

## Chapter 13

### RESOLVE, Opening Lower Chain Lake, in Washington County, to Fishing for Pickerel.

Fishing for pickerel in Lower Chain lake; regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Lower Chain lake, in Washington county, Township 5 N. D., to pickerel fishing.

## Chapter 14

### RESOLVE, Opening Adams Pond to Fishing.

Adams pond; opened to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Adams pond, in the town of Bridgton, to all fishing under the general law of the state.

## Chapter 15

### RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Barker's Pond.

Fishing in Barker's pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Barker's pond, in Lyman and Dayton, in the county of

York, to ice fishing for pickerel, white perch, hornpout, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs and smelts from the time ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring, and for all fish (except bass) during February and March of each year.

**Chapter 16****RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Hargraves Mill Pond, Dog or Mud Pond and Round Pond.**

Fishing in Hargraves Mill pond, Dog or Mud pond and Round pond, regulated. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue rules and regulations opening to ice fishing for common fish Hargraves Mill pond, in Shapleigh, Dog or Mud pond and Round pond in Newfield, all in the county of York, from the time the ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring, and for all fish (except bass) during February and March.

**Chapter 17****RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Swan Pond.**

Fishing in Swan pond, regulated. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation, closing Swan pond, in Lyman in the county of York, to ice fishing for all fish except that it shall be open to ice fishing on Saturdays, Sundays and Mondays during the month of February only each year.

**Chapter 18****RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Cumberland and York Counties.**

Fishing in Cumberland and York counties, regulated. **Resolved:** That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing a daily bag limit of 15 trout per person per day from all waters in Cumberland and York counties, not now having a daily bag limit already established of less than 15 trout.
