Chapter 25

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Rattlesnake Pond.

Fishing in Rattlesnake pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Rattlesnake pond in Brownfield, Oxford county, to ice fishing for pickerel, white perch, hornpout, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs and smelts from the time the ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring, and for all fish (except bass) during February and March.

Chapter 26

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Dead River in Orland.

Fishing in Dead river in Orland, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Dead river in Orland, county of Hancock, to ice fishing for pickerel, white perch, hornpout, yellow perch, eels, cusk, chubs and smelts from the time the ice forms in the fall until it goes out in the spring and for all fish (except bass) during February, March and April, to a point established by red posts on either bank, I mile above Alamoosook pond.

Chapter 27

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Watchic Pond.

Fishing in Watchic pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation opening Watchic pond in Standish, county of Cumberland to fishing under the general law.
