Chapter 35

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing on Narraguagus River.

Fishing on Narraguagus river, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation permitting fly fishing for Atlantic salmon on the Narraguagus river in the county of Washington, but no salmon may be taken from any fishway on said river.

Chapter 36

RESOLVE, Granting Authority to the Forestry Department to Convey Certain Land to Zealie A. Smith, of Springfield.

Forestry department authorized to convey certain land. Resolved: That the forest commissioner be, and hereby is, authorized to convey the interest of the state in the following described lot to Zealie A. Smith, of Springfield, for the sum of \$11.15: 1 acre of a 20 acre tract in T. 7, R. 2, N. B. P. P., Washington county.

Chapter 37

RESOLVE, Regulating Taking of Smelts from the Tributaries of Crotched Pond.

Taking of smelts from tributaries of Crotched pond, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation prohibiting the taking of smelts from any of the tributaries of Crotched pond or Echo lake, so-called, in the county of Kennebec.

Approved March 8, 1941
