As Passed by the Ninetieth Legislature

(Effective July 26, 1941)

Chapter 41

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Lake Embden.

Fishing in Lake Embden, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation establishing April 20th as the opening date on which it shall be legal to fish in Lake Embden in Embden, county of Somerset.

Approved March 8, 1941

Chapter 42

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing on Echo Lake.

Fishing on Echo lake, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation prohibiting any person from taking more than 2 togue in 1 day and any group of persons that use the same boat at the same time from taking more than 3 togue in the aggregate during the day they used the same boat on Crotched pond or Echo lake, so-called, in Kennebec county.

Chapter 43

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing in Certain Piscataquis County Waters.

Fishing in certain Piscataquis county waters, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue rules and regulations closing to all fishing the following brooks and streams and their tributaries, all in the county of Piscataquis:

Schoodic stream in Lakeview Plantation, and Medford Township from the dam at Schoodic lake to its junction with the Piscataquis river.

Whetstone brook in Brownville and Williamsburg Township, from its headwaters to a point 100 yards below the concrete bridge on the main road between Brownville and Brownville Junction on highway route No. 221.

Houston brook in Katahdin Iron Works Township, from the western line of said Katahdin Iron Works Township to its junction with the west branch of the Pleasant river.

Approved March 8, 1941
