Chapter 57

RESOLVE, in Favor of Tri City Fish and Game Association.

Tri City Fish and Game Association, reimbursed. Resolved: That the sum of \$97.72 be, and hereby is, appropriated to be taken from the funds available for the use of the department of inland fisheries and game, to be paid to the Tri City Fish and Game Association of Hallowell to be used to defray $\frac{1}{2}$ the cost of screening Vaughan brook in the city of Hallowell.

Chapter 58

RESOLVE, Regulating Fishing for Smelts in Waters of Androscoggin Watershed.

Androscoggin watershed; smelt fishing, regulated. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, authorized and directed to issue a rule and regulation making it unlawful to fish for, take, catch or kill any smelt at any time in all waters of the Androscoggin watershed above Middle dam, said dam being located at the outlet of Lower Richardson lake.

Chapter 59

RESOLVE, Closing Smith Pond to Fishing.

Smith pond, closed to fishing. Resolved: That the commissioner of inland fisheries and game be, and hereby is, directed to issue a rule and regulation closing Smith pond in the town of Swanville to ice fishing for a period of 5 years.

Chapter 60

RESOLVE, in Favor of George W. Pettingill, of Livermore Falls.

George W. Pettingill; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$150 to be paid to George W. Pettingill,
