Chapter 88

RESOLVE, Appropriating Money to Repair Fish Way at Aroostook Falls.

Fish way at Aroostook Falls; repairing of. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$500 to be expended by the commissioner of inland fisheries and game, for repairing the fish way at Aroostook Falls on the Aroostook river in the Province of New Brunswick. Any and all acts done in compliance with this resolve in the Province of New Brunswick shall be with the consent and approval of said Province.

Chapter 89

RESOLVE, in Favor of Miss Leila C. Gaines, of Saco.

Miss Leila C. Gaines; compensated. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$152 to be paid to Miss Leila C. Gaines, of Saco, as a full and final settlement of all claims against the state for personal losses incurred by her in the performance of her duty as an officer of the state; said sum to be paid from the general funds of the state.

Chapter 90

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Propagation of Lobsters.

Rearing station for propagation of lobsters, established. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$20,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1942, and \$20,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1943, for the purpose of establishing a lobster hatchery and rearing station for the propagation of lobsters; the same to be expended under the direction of the department of sea and shore fisheries.
