As Passed by the Ninetieth Legislature

(Effective July 26, 1941)

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“old dam” so-called on the “Woodcock property”, so-called, now owned by the said Whiting; provided, however, that the dam shall have a base of approximately 3 feet in height with flush boards of about 2 feet in height, a total of about 5 feet in height, and shall be about 50 feet in length; and provided further that this dam shall be built and maintained at the expense of the said Whiting, and that any and all damage accruing to persons, firms and corporations because of the building of said dam, including damage caused by flowage, shall be and is hereby declared to be a liability of the said Whiting.

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### Chapter 113

#### RESOLVE, in Favor of the City of Eastport.

City of Eastport; transfer of appropriation. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, transferred the sum of \$2,000 from the general highway fund to the highway equipment fund to offset certain compressor charges to the city of Eastport in connection with the repair and materials for miscellaneous streets, roads and bridges.

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### Chapter 114

#### RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Farmington.

Town of Farmington; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to the town of Farmington, the sum of \$143.03; it being the amount paid by said town for pauper supplies for Richard Crocker, state pauper; said sum to be taken from the general funds of the state.
