Chapter 115

RESOLVE, for the Purchase of One Hundred Copies of "Sesquicentennial History of Greene."

"Sesquicentennial History of Greene"; purchase of. **Resolved:** That the state purchase 100 copies of the book entitled "Sesquicentennial History of Greene" written by W. L. Mower, at \$5 per copy, said books to be exchanged or distributed at the discretion of the state librarian; and that there be, and hereby is, appropriated for this purpose the sum of \$500.

Chapter 116

RESOLVE, to Repeal a Resolve Providing for a State Pension for Elizabeth McNaughton of Bangor.

Resolves, 1939, c. 77, repealed in part. **Resolved:** That that part of chapter 77 of the resolves of 1939 which provides for a state pension for Elizabeth McNaughton, of Bangor, be, and hereby is, repealed.

Approved April 11, 1941

Chapter 117

RESOLVE, Dividing the State into Senatorial Districts.

Apportionment of senatorial districts. **Resolved:** That for the 91st legislature and the succeeding legislatures to and including that of the year 1951, the state be, and hereby is, divided into 16 districts for the choice of senators, and each district shall be entitled to elect the number of senators herein provided, in the manner prescribed by the constitution.

The County of York shall form the 1st district, and be entitled to elect 3 senators.

The County of Cumberland shall form the 2nd district, and be entitled to elect 4 senators.

The County of Oxford shall form the 3rd district, and be entitled to elect 2 senators.
