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## Chapter 123

**RESOLVE**, to Repeal a Resolve Providing for a State Pension for Johanna T. Kelleher.

Resolves, 1917, c. 117, repealed in part. Resolved: That that part of chapter 117 of the resolves of 1917 which provides for a state pension for Johanna T. Kelleher, be, and hereby is, repealed, to become effective July 1, 1941.

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## Chapter 124

**RESOLVE**, in Favor of Wilfred Duquette of Brunswick.

Wilfred Duquette; compensated. Resolved: That Wilfred Duquette be compensated by Cumberland county for the exercise of extra duty as acting judge of the Brunswick municipal court for the period from April 1, 1935 to April 22, 1935, by the payment of the sum of \$57.54, and for the exercise of extra clerical work for the period from August 9, 1940 to November 3, 1940, by the payment of the sum of \$31.

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## Chapter 125

**RESOLVE**, Relating to Fishing in Penobscot Bay.

Fishing in Penobscot bay. Resolved: That the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries be, and hereby is, directed to repeal rule and regulation numbered 127, relating to use of purse and drag seines in certain waters, of the official rules and regulations of the department, and to issue the following rule and regulation in place thereof:

‘No person shall use any purse, drag or stop seines in the following waters:

In Casco bay north of a line drawn easterly from Prince’s point in the town of Yarmouth to Bear Island in the town of Phippsburg, excepting for smelts, bluebacks, and spurling; in Kennebec river above a line drawn across said river from Fort Popham in the town of Phippsburg to a point opposite at the lower end of Long Island in the town of Georgetown; in
