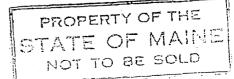

RESOLVES

OF THE

STATE OF MAINE

As Passed by the Ninetieth Legislature

(Effective July 26, 1941)

CHAP, 126

Sheepscot river above a bridge leading from Wiscasset to Edgecomb: in Damariscotta river above a line drawn from Farnham's head in the town of Boothbay to a point opposite on the shore in the town of Bristol, excepting the use of drag seines between the above line and The Ledges, for all fish excepting alewives; in Medomak river, above a line drawn from Martin's point in the town of Friendship, westerly by the northeast end of Hog Island to a point opposite in the town of Bremen, or take smelts in said river and its tributaries in any other way than by hook and line; in Georges river, above a line drawn from Hooper's point in the town of St. George, westerly past the northerly end of Caldwell's Island to a point opposite on the shore in the town of Cushing, or take smelts in said river and its tributaries in any other way than by hook and line, or dip-nets, but purse seines and drag seines may be used, from May 15 to December 1 of each year in all bays, inlets, rivers and harbors east of the west shore of the Penobscot bay and river, except in places where private and special laws are to the contrary in which places purse seines, drag seines and stop seines may be used from May 15 to November 15 of each year for the purpose of catching herring. The use of purse, drag or stop seines within a distance of ½ of a nautical mile measured on the water from any fish weir in any of the waters of the state east of White Head on the west shore of Penobscot bay is hereby prohibited; but such seines may be used for the taking of smelts and for the purpose of taking fish in weirs, but shall not be used in any water in which their use is prohibited by special or general Taking or fishing for, by nonresidents of the state of Maine, for commercial purposes, herring within the territorial waters of the state is hereby prohibited. No person whose residence may be questioned shall be permitted to make application unless and until he shall have established to the satisfaction of the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries a continuous bona fide residence in the state of Maine for 5 years next immediately preceding the date of his application. Whoever violates any provision hereof shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$500 for each offense, to be recovered by complaint, indictment, or action of debt.'

Chapter 126

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of North Haven.

Town of North Haven; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of the town of North Haven, the sum of \$2500 to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1943, to aid

in repairing the road beginning at the end of the special resolve road, socalled, by the barn of Frank Waterman, and running in a southwesterly direction on state aid road number 4; from the unexpended appropriation made by chapter 86 of the resolves of 1939 in favor of the city of Rockland for the realignment of route 17.

Chapter 127

RESOLVE, in Favor of the City of Rockland.

City of Rockland; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated the sum of \$2000 in favor of the city of Rockland to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1942, to aid in repairing "Broadway", so-called, from the unexpended appropriation made by chapter 86 of the resolves of 1939 in favor of the city of Rockland for the realignment of route 17.

Chapter 128

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of St. George.

Town of St. George; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated in favor of the town of St. George the sum of \$2500 to be expended during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1942, from the unexpended appropriation made by chapter 86 of the resolves of 1939 in favor of the city of Rockland for the realignment of route 17, to build the road from Wallston to the Turkey Cove road, so-called, in the town of St. George.

Chapter 129

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Town of Charleston.

Town of Charleston; appropriation for. Resolved: That the appropriation made by the 89th Legislature in favor of the town of Charleston to aid in repairing Puddle Dock road, so-called, in that town, be and hereby
