(Effective July 26, 1941)

Chapter 132

RESOLVE, to Apportion One Hundred and Fifty-one Representatives Among the Several Counties, Cities, Towns, Plantations and Classes in the State of Maine.

Apportionment of representatives to the legislature. Resolved: That for the 91st legislature to and including that of the year of 1951:

The county of Androscoggin shall choose 13 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Auburn, 3 representatives; Lewiston, 5 representatives; Lisbon, 1 representative; Livermore and Livermore Falls, 1 representative; Mechanic Falls, Minot, and Turner, 1 representative; Greene, Poland, and Wales, 1 representative; Durham, Leeds, and Webster, 1 representative.

The county of Aroostook shall choose 16 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Caribou, 1 representative; Fort Fairfield, 1 representative; Presque Isle, 1 representative; Houlton, 1 representative; Dyer Brook, Hammond Plantation, Littleton, Ludlow, Merrill, Moro Plantation, New Limerick, Oakfield, and Smyrna, 1 representative; Blaine, Bridgewater, E Plantation, Mars Hill, and Monticello, 1 representative; Benedicta, Crystal, Hersey, Island Falls, Macwahoc, Sherman, Silver Ridge Plantation, Molunkus (unorganized), and South Molunkus (unorganized), 1 representative; Amity, Bancroft, Cary Plantation, Glenwood Plantation, Haynesville, Hodgdon, Linneus, Orient, Reed Plantation, and Weston, 1 representative; Caswell, Connor, Cyr Plantation, Hamlin Plantation, Limestone, Stockholm, Westmanland Plantation, and 16 R-4 (unorganized), 1 representative; Grand Isle and Van Buren, 1 representative; Ashland, Castle Hill, Garfield Plantation, Masardis, Nashville Plantation, Oxbow Plantation, Portage Lake, and the unorganized townships of Squa Pan, 9 R-4, St. Croix, and 11 R-4, 1 representative; New Sweden, Perham, Washburn, and Woodland, 1 representative; Chapman, Easton, Mapleton, Wade, and Westfield, 1 representative; Frenchville, Madawaska, St. Agatha, Guerette (unorganized), Sinclair (unorganized), and 17 R-5 (unorganized), 1 representative; Fort Kent and Wallagrass, 1 representative; Allagash Plantation, Eagle Lake, New Canada Plantation, St. Francis Plantation, St. John Plantation, Winterville Plantation, and the unorganized townships of 14 R-6, 15 R-6, 16 R-6, 16 R-12, 20 R-11 and 12, and 11 R-14, 1 representative.

The county of Cumberland shall choose 24 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Portland, 7 representatives; Westbrook, 2 representatives; South Portland, 3 representatives; Brunswick, 2 representatives; Gorham, 1 representative; Bridgton, 1 representative; Pownal and Freeport, 1 representative; Cumberland and Falmouth, 1 representative; Scar-

borough and Cape Elizabeth, 1 representative; Sebago, Baldwin, and Standish, 1 representative; Harrison, Otisfield and Windham, 1 representative; Gray, Raymond, and New Gloucester, 1 representative; Harpswell, Casco, and Naples, 1 representative; Yarmouth and North Yarmouth, 1 representative.

The county of Franklin shall choose 4 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Jay and Wilton, 1 representative; Chesterville, Farmington, New Sharon, and Temple, 1 representative; Avon, Carthage, Industry, Madrid, New Vineyard, Perkins Plantation, Phillips, Strong, Washington Plantation, and Weld, 1 representative; Coplin Plantation, Dallas Plantation, Eustis, Kingfield, Lang Plantation, Lowell, Rangeley, Rangeley Plantation, Salem, Sandy River Plantation, and the unorganized townships of Coburn Gore, Freeman, Gore north of 2 and 3, Jerusalem, Redington, Crocker, Wyman, and Jim Pond, 1 representative.

The county of Hancock shall choose 6 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Brooklin, Brooksville, Deer Isle, Sedgwick, Stonington, and the unorganized territory of Bear Island, Eagle Island, and Great Spruce Head, 1 representative; Bucksport, Castine, Dedham, Penobscot, Orland, and Verona, 1 representative; Bluehill, Ellsworth, Surry, and No. 8 S. D. (unorganized), 1 representative; Bar Harbor, Hancock, and Trenton, 1 representative; Cranberry Isle, Lamoine, Long Island Plantation, Mt. Desert, Tremont, Southwest Harbor, and Swan's Island, 1 representative; Amherst, Aurora, Eastbrook, Franklin, Gouldsboro, Mariaville, Osborn Plantation, Otis, Plantation No. 21, Plantation No. 33, Sorrento, Sullivan, Waltham, Winter Harbor, No. 3 N. D. B. P. P. (unorganized), and No. 10 S. D. (unorganized), 1 representative.

The county of Kennebec shall choose 13 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Augusta, 2 representatives; Waterville, 2 representatives; Gardiner, 1 representative; Albion, Benton, Clinton, and Unity Plantation, 1 representative; Vassalboro and Winslow, 1 representative; Chelsea and Farmingdale, 1 representative; China, Pittston, Randolph, and Windsor, 1 representative; Hallowell, Manchester, and West Gardiner, 1 representative; Litchfield, Monmouth, and Winthrop, 1 representative; Fayette, Mt. Vernon, Readfield, Rome, Wayne, and Vienna, 1 representative; Belgrade, Oakland, and Sidney, 1 representative.

The county of Knox shall choose 6 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Rockland, 2 representatives; Cushing, Friendship, Owl's Head, Thomaston, and South Thomaston, 1 representative; Rockport, Union, Warren, and Washington, 1 representative; Appleton, Camden, and Hope, 1 representative; Isle au Haut, Matinicus, North Haven, St. George, Vinalhaven, and Criehaven (unorganized), 1 representative.

The county of Lincoln shall choose 3 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Alna, Jefferson, Newcastle, Somerville, Waldoboro, and Whitefield, 1 representative; Boothbay, Boothbay Harbor, Bristol, Monhegan, Muscongus Island, South Bristol, and Southport, 1 representative; Bremen, Dresden, Damariscotta, Edgecomb, Nobleboro, Westport, and Wiscasset, 1 representative.

The county of Oxford shall choose 8 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Dixfield and Mexico, 1 representative; Andover, Byron, Roxbury, and Rumford, 2 representatives; Buckfield, Canton, Hartford, Hebron, Peru, and Sumner, 1 representative; Milton Plantation, Paris, and Woodstock, 1 representative; Lovell, Norway, Oxford, and Waterford, 1 representative; Brownfield, Denmark, Fryeburg, Hiram, Porter, and Sweden, 1 representative; Albany, Bethel, Gilead, Grafton (unorganized), Greenwood, Hanover, Lincoln Plantation, Mason, Magalloway Plantation, Newry, Richardson, Stow, Stoneham, Township C, Upton, and the unorganized townships of 4 R-1, 4 R-2, and 5 R-4, 1 representative.

The county of Penobscot shall choose 17 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Bangor, 4 representatives; Brewer, 1 representative; Old Town, 1 representative; Dexter and Garland, 1 representative; Corinna, Exeter, Newport, and Stetson, 1 representative; Carmel, Dixmont, Etna, Kenduskeag, Levant, Newburg, and Plymouth, 1 representative; Alton, Argyle (unorganized), Bradford, Charleston, Corinth, Edinburg, Howland, Hudson, Lagrange, Maxfield, and Seboeis, 1 representative; Glenburn, Hampden, and Hermon, 1 representative; Milford and Orono, 1 representative; Millinocket, Indian Township No. 3 (unorganized) (Norcross), Indian Township No. 4 (unorganized) (Perkins), and the wild land townships I. R-7, and A. R-8 and 9, 1 representative; Bradley, Clifton, Eddington, Greenbush, Greenfield, Holden, Orrington, and Veazie, 1 representative; Burlington, Enfield, Grand Falls Plantation, Lincoln, Lowell, and Passadumkeag, 1 representative; Carroll Plantation, Chester, Drew Plantation, Kingman Plantation, Lakeville Plantation, Lee, Mattawankeag, Prentiss Plantation, Springfield, Webster Plantation, Winn, and Woodville, 1 representative; East Millinocket, Medway, Mt. Chase, Patten, Stacyville, and the wild land townships 2 R-6 (East Division), 2 R-6 (Davidson), 2 R-8, 8 R-7, and 3 R-8, 1 representative.

The county of Piscataquis shall choose 4 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Blanchard, Elliottsville Plantation, Greenville, Kingsbury Plantation, Monson, Shirley, Wellington, Willimantic, and the unorganized townships of Big Squaw Mountain, Chesuncook, French Township, Kineo, and Little Squaw Mountain, 1 representative; Abbot, Barnard, Bowerbank, Brownville, Guilford, Parkman, Katahdin Iron Works (unor-

ganized), and Williamsburg (unorganized), 1 representative; Dover-Foxcroft and Sangerville, 1 representative; Atkinson, Lake View Plantation, Medford (unorganized), Milo, Orneville, and Sebec, 1 representative.

The county of Sagadahoc shall choose 4 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Bath, 2 representatives; Bowdoinham, Bowdoin, Georgetown, Perkins, and Richmond, 1 representative; Arrowsic, Phippsburg, Topsham, West Bath, and Woolwich, 1 representative.

The county of Somerset shall choose 7 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Skowhegan, 1 representative; Fairfield, Mercer, and Smithfield, 1 representative; Cornville, Detroit, Palmyra, and Pittsfield, 1 representative; Cambridge, Canaan, Harmony, Hartland, Ripley, and St. Albans, 1 representative; Athens, Madison, and Solon, 1 representative; Anson, Embden, Norridgewock, and Starks, 1 representative; Bingham, Moscow, New Portland, Bigelow Plantation, Brighton Plantation, Caratunk Plantation, Dead River Plantation, Dennistown Plantation, Flagstaff Plantation, Highland Plantation, Jackman Plantation, Moose River Plantation, Pleasant Ridge Plantation, West Forks Plantation, the unorganized townships of Askwith, Attean, Concord, Holeb, Lexington, Long Pond, Misery Gore, Moxie Gore, Rockwood, Sandwich Academy Grant, Sand Bar Tract, Seboomook, and all the other unorganized townships north of Bingham, Brighton, Concord and Lexington, 1 representative.

The county of Waldo shall choose 4 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Belfast, 1 representative; Belmont, Freedom, Knox, Liberty, Lincolnville, Morrill, Montville, Northport, Palermo, and Searsmont, 1 representative; Brooks, Burnham, Jackson, Monroe, Swanville, Thorndike, Troy, Unity, and Waldo, 1 representative; Frankfort, Islesboro, Prospect, Searsport, Stockton Springs, and Winterport, 1 representative.

The county of Washington shall choose 8 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Calais, 1 representative; Eastport, 1 representative; Addison, Beddington, Cherryfield, Columbia, Deblois, Harrington, Milbridge, and Steuben, 1 representative; Beals, Columbia Falls, Cutler, Jonesboro, Jonesport, and Machiasport, 1 representative; Centerville, East Machias, Machias, Marion, Marshfield, Northfield, No. 18 Plantation, Roque Bluffs, Wesley, Whitneyville, No. 26 E. D. (unorganized), and No. 27 E. D. (unorganized), 1 representative; Alexander, Charlotte, Cooper, Crawford, Dennysville, Meddybemps, No. 14 Plantation, Pembroke, Perry, and Robbinston, 1 representative; Edmunds, Lubec, Trescott, and Whiting, 1 representative; Baileyville, Brookton, Codyville, Danforth, No. 5 Plantation, No. 21 Plantation, Princeton, Talmadge, Vanceboro, Waite, and the unorganized townships of Baring, Forest City, Grand Lake Stream, Indian

Township, Kossuth, Lambert Lake, Topsfield, and 10 R-3 (unorganized), 1 representative.

The county of York shall choose 14 representatives to be apportioned as follows: Biddeford, 3 representatives; Saco, 1 representative; Sanford, 2 representatives; Berwick and South Berwick, 1 representative; Kennebunk and Kennebunkport, 1 representative; North Kennebunkport, Old Orchard Beach, and York, 1 representative; Lebanon, North Berwick, and Wells, 1 representative; Buxton, Dayton, Hollis, and Lyman, 1 representative; Cornish, Limerick, Limington, and Parsonsfield, 1 representative; Acton, Alfred, Newfield, Shapleigh, and Waterboro, 1 representative; Eliot and Kittery, 1 representative.

Chapter 133

RESOLVE, in Favor of the Towns in the Hancock-Sullivan Bridge District.

Towns in Hancock-Sullivan Bridge District; appropriation for. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated from the general highway fund, in favor of the towns in the Hancock-Sullivan bridge district, the sum of \$4360 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1942, and the sum of \$4180 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1943; these sums to be paid to the Hancock-Sullivan Bridge District for the purpose of retiring bonds and interest and relieving the towns in said district. Any unexpended balance of the foregoing appropriation shall not lapse but shall be credited to the aforesaid district to be used for the aforesaid purposes.

RESOLVE, to Reimburse Aroostook Central Institute for Tuition Owed by the Town of Blaine.

Aroostook Central Institute, reimbursed. Resolved: That there be, and hereby is, appropriated to be paid to Aroostook Central Institute, the sum of \$2235.07, to reimburse said institute for tuition owed by the town of Blaine, said sum to be paid from the general funds of the state.
