Chapter 47

AN ACT Relating to Collection and Disposition of Money Received Under the Inland Fish and Game Laws.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 99, amended. The 1st paragraph of section 99 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'All fines and penalties recovered and money received, or collected under any provision of this chapter, or for sale of seized fish or game, or furbearing animals, or parts thereof, after deducting legal taxable costs shall be paid within 30 days by the person receiving the same to the commissioner, to be paid by him to the treasurer of state. All officers' fees taxed against a respondent, if any, under any provision of this chapter, which are not paid or recovered from the respondent shall not be assumed or paid by the county where the offense was committed. All fees, fines and penalties recovered and money received, or collected, and paid to the treasurer of state as aforesaid ~~in excess of \$100,000~~ shall be credited to the department of inland fisheries and game for the operation of fish hatcheries and feeding stations for fish, for the protection of fish, game and birds, and for printing the report of said commissioner and other expenses incident to the administration of said department, and shall be expended by the said commissioner for the purposes for which said department is created.'

Chapter 48

AN ACT Relating to Unstamped Cigarettes and Forfeiture Proceedings.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. I. P. L., 1941, c. 298, § 11, amended. Section 11 of chapter 298 of the public laws of 1941 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 11. Unstamped cigarettes subject to confiscation. Any cigarettes found at any place in this state without stamps affixed thereto as required by this act, unless such cigarettes shall be in the possession of a licensed
