CHAP. 54

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 12, § 66, amended. Section 66 of chapter 12 of the revised statutes is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

'Sec. 66. Taxes, how assessed. The tax shall be assessed on the April return by the 15th day of April and shall be payable on or before May 10th. The tax shall be assessed on the October return by the 15th day of October and shall be payable on or before November 10th.'

Chapter 53

AN ACT Relative to Hunting of Game Birds in York County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 38, § 55, amended. The 3rd paragraph of section 55 of chapter 38 of the revised statutes, as revised, is hereby amended to read as follows:

'It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, capture, kill, take, possess, buy, or sell any migratory game bird at any time; but it shall not be deemed to be a violation of this chapter to hunt, capture, kill, take, possess, buy, or sell any migratory game bird or part thereof at the times, in the manner and numbers, and by the means specifically permitted by regulations adopted and approved pursuant to the provisions of the Federal Migratory Bird Treaty Act (Act of Congress approved July 3, 1918). ~~Provided, however, that no migratory game bird shall be hunted, captured or killed in the county of York before October 1st of each year.~~

Chapter 54

AN ACT Relating to Aid to the Blind.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1937, c. 210, § 6, amended. Section 6 of chapter 210 of the public laws of 1937 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 6. Amount of aid. The amount of aid which any such person shall receive shall be determined on a budgetary basis with due regard to the conditions existing in each case and in accordance with the rules and regulations made by the department. This aid shall be sufficient, when
