PUBLIC LAWS

by the public utilities commission upon application of to it by any company corporation whose track is, or tracks are, so crossed, made within sixty days after written notice has been served thereon by the municipal officers of any town in which such way is located, requesting such company to build and maintain so much of such way as is within the limits of its road or upon application by the municipal officers of any town in which the crossing is located or upon application by the state highway commission.'

Chapter 182

AN ACT Relating to the Salary of the Sheriff of Lincoln County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 125, § 42, amended. The 11th line of section 42 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Lincoln, ~~eight hundred dollars~~ \$1,200.'

Chapter 183

AN ACT Relating to the Amount to be Paid for Clerk Hire in the Office of the Recorder of the Municipal Court of the City of Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 125, § 46, amended. The 4th paragraph of section 46 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes, as amended by chapter 27 of the public laws of 1931, is hereby further amended so that said paragraph, so far as it refers to the amount to be paid for clerk hire in the office of the recorder of the Portland municipal court, shall read as follows:

'for clerks in the office of the recorder of the Portland municipal court, ~~twenty four hundred ninety six dollars~~ \$2,912;'

Sec. 2. Limitation of act. This act shall remain in force for a period of 2 years only. It is the intent of the legislature to change the present statute for a period of 2 years only, after which period the present statute shall return to full force and effect.
