#### RECORDS OF OATHS OF TOWN CLERKS

CHAP. 210

'Lincoln county: for clerks in the office of register of deeds, \$800, and such additional sum not exceeding \$300, when necessary, subject to the approval of the county commissioners; for clerks in the office of register of probate, \$500; for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, two hundred dollars \$240.'

### Chapter 209

### AN ACT Increasing the Salary of Clerks in the Office of Register of Probate of Lincoln County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

**R. S., c. 125, § 46, amended.** The 9th paragraph of section 46 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

'Lincoln county: for clerks in the office of register of deeds, \$800, and such additional sum not exceeding \$300, when necessary, subject to the approval of the county commissioners; for clerks in the office of register of probate, \$500 \$600; for clerks in the office of clerk of courts, \$200.'

### Chapter 210

#### AN ACT Relating to Records of Oaths in the Office of Town Clerks.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Records of oaths in office of town clerks. A record by the town clerk that a town officer was duly sworn by the moderator in open town meeting in the presence of the clerk for a stated municipal office shall be sufficient evidence that such officer was legally sworn for said office and the recording of the entire oath shall not be required.

Effective July 9, 1943
