Chapter 218

AN ACT Relating to the Penalty for Interfering with any Contrivance used in the Lobster Industry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P. L., 1933, c. 2, § 83, amended. The 2nd sentence of section 83 of chapter 2 of the public laws of 1933 is hereby amended to read as follows:

'Whoever violates any provision of this section shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$20, nor more than \$50; \$300, or by imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. The license of any person convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall be revoked immediately by the commissioner of sea and shore fisheries on receipt of an attested copy of the court records, without further hearing; and such person shall not be licensed again under this chapter for a period of 3 years. Provided, however, that no action, complaint, or indictment shall be maintained under this section unless the name of the owner of all such traps shall be carved or branded in legible letters, not less than ¾ of an inch in length, on all the buoys connected with such traps.'

Chapter 219

AN ACT Relating to the Office of State Auditor.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 125, § 15, amended. Section 15 of chapter 125 of the revised statutes, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
